GETTING STARTED WITH YOUR TIME TIMER® BRAILLE TIMER

INSTALL 1 AA BATTERY

The battery compartment is located on the back of the Time Timer® Braille timer. Simply pull battery cover down to insert batteries into compartment. Close battery compartment by pressing closed until you hear a "click".

Requires 1 AA battery


SOUND PREFERENCE

The timer itself is quiet—no distracting ticking sound—but you can choose whether or not to have an audible alert sound when time is complete. Simply use the on/off switch on the back of the timer to control audio alerts.



ORIENT AND SET YOUR TIMER

Locate the foldable feet on the back bottom portion of the timer, or the protruding nubs on the bottom edge of the timer - this is the bottom and should be closest to the user or table surface. Use the tactile set bar on the disk and turn counter-clockwise until you reach your chosen amount of time. Immediately, your new timer will begin to countdown, the high contrast disk with tactile set bar and raised braille numbers will reveal the time left.

BATTERY RECOMMENDATIONS

We recommend using high-quality, name-brand alkaline batteries to ensure accurate timing. You may use rechargeable batteries with Time Timer, but they may deplete more quickly than traditional batteries. If you do not plan to use your Time Timer for an extended period of time (several weeks or more), please remove the battery to avoid corrosion.
